In Sept. a new cedar shingle roof was put on the RC House completing the repairs for the year.



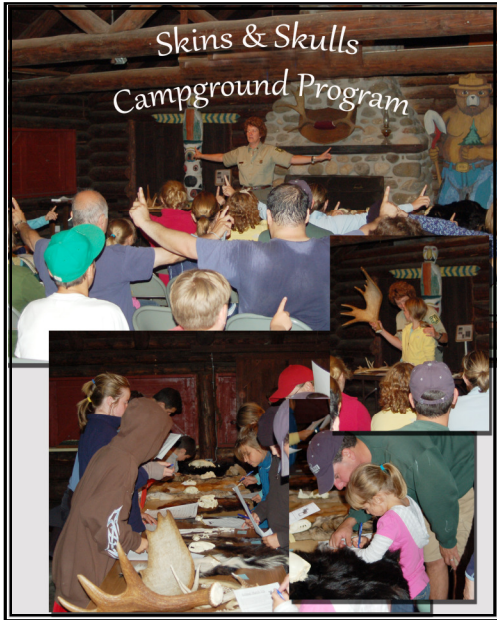
Successful Programs

- ◆ Campground programs— Programs were held every Saturday night at campgrounds throughout the White Mountain National Forest. These programs included topics such as: Edible Plants in the WMNF, Moose: Monarch of the North, Skins & Skulls of Mammals in the White Mountains, and many more.
- ◆ Cooper demonstrations at the Russell-Colbath Barn demonstrating the craft of making barrels and buckets by hand
- ◆ Interpreter at the RC House—A costumed interpreter staffed the Russell-Colbath House during the summer season, portraying daily life in the White Mountains during the 19th century.
- ◆ Mountaineer Rick Wilcox presented techniques and stories of search-and-rescue missions in the White Mountains.
- ◆ Assisted the Bartlett Recreation Dept. with group programs.

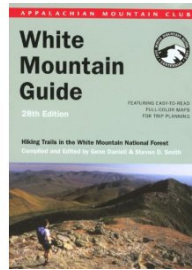
