The White Mountain National Forest is one of the most heavily used forests in the U.S. It is within a day's drive of 80 million people. Between 6 and 7 million visitors a year picnic, camp, hike, ski, or snowmobile on Forest land. These same Forest lands produce timber, provide watersheds for town supplies, and habitat for plants and animals.




The White Mountains Interpretive Association (WMIA) was formed in 1985 to help visitors develop an understanding of and appreciation for these resources. Each year over 15,000 people attend various interpretive efforts supported by the WMIA.

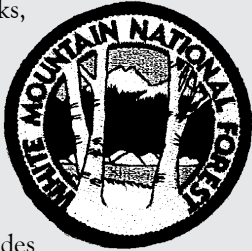
Who We Are
